Tabletop display to promote your pin design to the public. Display can be used in the presentation if desired. Displays must fit in an 28"x 28" space and cannot be taller than 48".

- Means of presentation: computer, tablet, notebook, poster/display, or other media of your choice if desired to make your presentation to the judges. The tabletop display may be used in your presentation if desired.
- Due to time constraints on our presentation schedule, projectors/screens will not be used.

Contest Notes, Themes, & Deadlines

- During orientation, students will be given a time for their presentation.
- Contestants will be permitted into the contest area at 10:00 a.m. and are encouraged to set up their display.
- Only contestants are allowed in the presentation areas during the contest. Additional time will be allotted after the orientation meeting for set-up of the tabletop display if needed.
- No observers will be permitted during the presentations, but observers are welcome to view the tabletop displays after all judging is completed.
- State contest presentation time is 5 7 minutes. Deductions will occur for presentations under 5 minutes or over 7 minutes.
- A contest debriefing will be held directly after close of contest, advisor may attend.
- Using original content is highly encouraged. However, small amounts of Creative Commons licensed graphics or commercial stock images maybe used only if accompanied by proof of license and provide attribution to credit the originator. Designs that violate copyright laws are subject to disqualification.
- Electronics should only be allowed in the competition area if used as part of the presentation. After the presentation, the judges will ask questions related to pin design, SkillsUSA, production process, professional development, workplace, technical and leadership skills.
- A question/Answer session regarding their design will be given a maximum of 3 mins.
 Each contestant is individually asked one question by each judge.
- Competitors are encouraged to memorize their presentation and use their display or visual aid only for quick reference.
- Competitors should have good eye contact and good rapport with the judges.
- Strong presentations have a commanding introduction, a series of strong supporting points and a conclusion which summarizes the topic.

	 Talking points should include how did the competitor produce the concept, the process in which the competitors designed the pin, why the competitor feels it represents their state, what its unique qualities are, why the pin would be desirable to wear, collect, or trade, at National Leadership and Skills Conference. Displays will be judged on the following criteria. Neatness Overall esthetic appeal Informative/educational value Cohesiveness Grammar and spelling Size Originality and creativity Overall effort

Special Notes/Rules for All Contests	 Started in 2024, all Skilled Trade State Contests (most leadership contests already use scenarios) will begin to add a scenario-based component. Wi-Fi will NOT BE AVAILABLE unless listed above. If you need WIFI access please plan to bring a hotspot. All safety requirements will be heavily enforced.
